In all of the following clauses, "Contractor" and "Offeror" mean Seller. 52.203-6 Restrictions on Subcontractor Sales to the Government (JUL 1995). This clause applies only if this contract exceeds \$100,000. 52.203-7 Anti-Kickback Procedures (excluding subparagraph (c)(1)) (JUL 1995).
